You must be within the legal salary limit, and hold a German or recognised foreign university degree, in order for an EU Blue Card to be issued. Federal Employment Agency consent is required for professions in mathematics, IT, science and engineering and for people holding foreign university degrees.	A researcher may be granted a residence permit for the purpose of academic research, if a hosting agreement or a contract, plus the content of a hosting agreement, with an accredited research organization has been duly signed. The hosting agreement must also declare the liability of the research organization for all costs possibly arising. The researcher needs to sustain its livelihood without the possibility of making demands on social benefits in Germany.	
The residence permit is issued with a two-year employer lo-	The permit is issued for the validity of the hosting agree-	
yalty clause. The validity of the permit is bound to the duration of the employment contract. If the contract is limited, the permit will be issued for the validity period + three months.
